IBA increases presence in Mt Isa area

Indigenous Business Australia (IBA) has celebrated increasing its presence in the Mt Isa region with a function held Tuesday evening at the Red Earth Hotel.

IBA views the Mt Isa region as an important area of growth with the enormous wealth of the mining and associated service industries providing business development and employment opportunities for Indigenous people.

General Manager Ron Morony said that IBA is aware of untapped Indigenous economic development potential in and around Mt Isa.

"We appointed Pat Williamson as a senior economic development officer in July this year to support business development and explore further opportunities," Mr Morony said.

Pat Williamson will be based in Mt Isa and travel regularly to locations from Mornington Island in the gulf to Birdsville in the south.

IBA also held a workshop with existing and prospective Indigenous business people and mining industry representatives to:

- provide information from companies in the region on their respective procurement processes for goods and services and forecasts for contract opportunities over the next twelve months
- provide Indigenous clients with an overview of contract work with mines and associated service industries.
- provide opportunities for company representatives and Indigenous business operators to network

"IBA plays an important role in assisting Indigenous people and community organisations to build assets and wealth so that future generations of Indigenous Australians can live in better circumstances than the current," Mr Morony said.

IBA provides a range of services and products that help Indigenous Australians create wealth and build assets for current and future generations.

"Our role is to look for commercial solutions to enable Aboriginal participation in the mainstream economy."

"IBA's range of support services include business and home loans, business mentoring, policy support and advice, investment and equity partnerships and construction capabilities," Mr Morony concluded.
